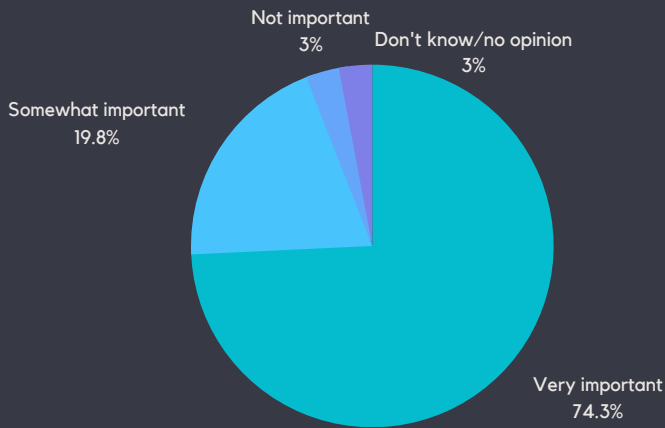

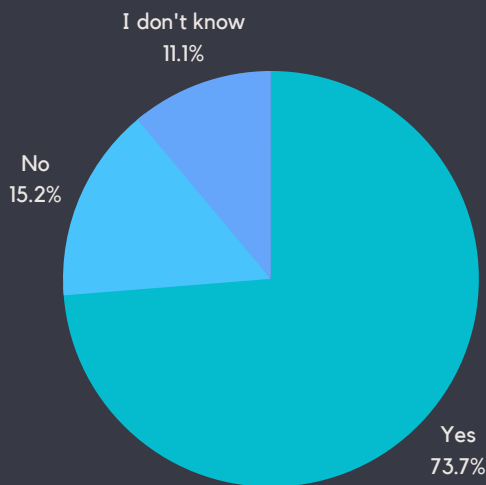
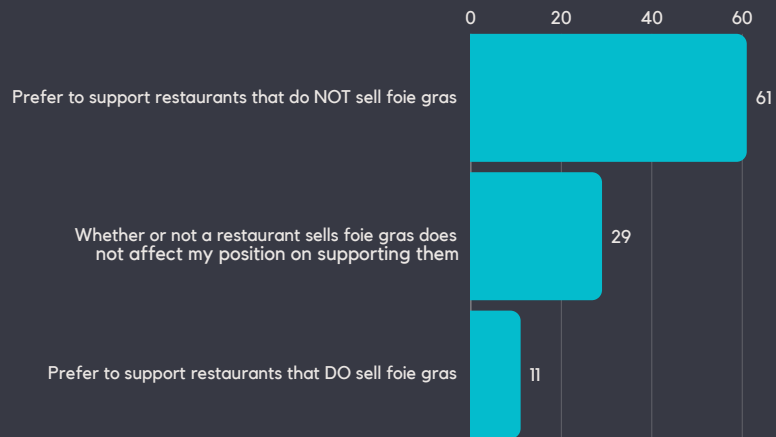


DC Wants Humane Treatment of Animals

In response to the the question "How important is it to you that animals raised for food be treated well?", 94% of surveyed DC voters said it is important. Support was distributed relatively evenly across the eight wards, ranging from 63% (Ward 8) to 86% (Ward 7) of respondents selecting "Very Important".

Consumers Dislike Foie Gras on the Menu

Force feeding has such a negative association that most people would rather not patronize restaurants that serve foie gras. When asked "Does whether a restaurant sells foie gras from force-fed birds affect if you're likely or not likely to support that restaurant?", nearly two thirds of respondents indicated a preference for restaurants that do not serve foie gras.



DC Supports a City-Wide Force Fed Products Ban

There is one thing meat-eaters, vegetarians, and vegans are unified in: the scourge of force feeding warrants action from DC Council. Approximately 3/4 of responses were in the support of a ban when asked "Would you support a city-wide law in DC to prohibit the sale of foie gras made by force-feeding birds?" Again, all eight wards were evenly distributed, ranging from 9-15% of "yes" answers coming from each ward (a perfect distribution would be 12.5%)
